Sunset Magazine Features West Basin Conservation Program

One of the country's most trusted and established lifestyle publications is shining their spotlight on West Basin's water conservation efforts! If you recently visited the Sunset Magazine website, you likely saw an article featuring our agency's Grass Replacement Rebate Program as a standout example of sustainable landscaping in Southern California.

This article introduces West Basin's water-saving resources to an expanded audience of people who may be inspired to rethink their own landscapes. It shares the conservation message that traditional grass lawns consume large amounts of water with limited ecological benefit and shares an easily accessible and compelling solution through our grass replacement rebate program—encouraging people to remove turf and install native, drought-tolerant gardens that are both beautiful and functional.

Eligible residents can receive \$3–\$6 per square foot of grass removed, plus \$100 per drought-tolerant tree (up to five trees planted). Participants also benefit from



free professional landscape design assistance, making it easier than ever to get started.

This West Basin rebate program is part of a community-wide effort to build a more water-resilient future—one garden at a time.

Save Water This Summer

Summer heat can lead to higher water use—but small changes make a big difference in conservation! Water landscapes early or late in the day to reduce evaporation (and consider covering your pool too), check your irrigation to quickly fix leaks, use a broom instead of a hose to clean hardscapes around your home and, if you must use a hose, makes sure it has a water-efficient nozzle.
