West Basin Municipal Water District is constructing a new recycled water pipeline and booster pump station that will expand recycled water use in the City of Torrance and bring the first drop of recycled water to the Palos Verdes Peninsula.

Location

Construction is underway for the booster pump station that will house the pumps needed to carry recycled water to higher elevations. The booster pump station will be located on the southeast corner of Lago Seco Park in Torrance by Ocean Avenue and West 238th Street.

What to Expect

Project activities at Lago Seco Park include mobilization, site preparation, foundation work, structural framing, utility installation and exterior and interior finishing.

- Some noise, dust and vibration during work activities
- Relocation of four parking spaces
- Through-traffic will be maintained at all times
- Paving, slurry sealing of entire parking area
- Striping of parking spaces

Background

The Palos Verdes Recycled Water Pipeline Project is a new 3.5-mile-long recycled water pipeline that will connect to West Basin's existing system in Torrance and deliver recycled water for irrigation purposes to Lago Seco and Los Arboles "Rocketship" Parks, two schools in Torrance, medians on PCH and Anza Avenue and the Palos Verdes Golf Club. The project also includes a booster pump station located at Lago Seco Park.
