RONALD C. SMITH PRESENTS WATER RELIABILITY 2020 AND PARTNERSHIPS THAT WORK TO THE NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR PUBLIC- PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS

CARSON, Calif. — Ronald C. (Ron) Smith, President of Board of Directors at West Basin Municipal Water District (West Basin), presented West Basin's Water Reliability 2020 program as he spoke about ocean-water desalination, recycling and conservation at the National Council for Public-Private Partnerships (NCPPP) meeting on September 9th.

President Smith spoke on a panel about PPP projects that have worked, describing the relationships between West Basin and the City of Los Angeles (a public-public partnership) and between West Basin and United Water (a public-private partnership) as examples that work to accomplish the mission of both agencies with respect to water recycling operations.

President Smith took the initiative to present the members of NCPPP with West Basin's plans to decrease imported water use and maximize water use efficiency with its Water Reliability 2020 program which aims to reduce our region's dependence on imported water from 66% to 33% by the year 2020. President Smith additionally shared West Basin's conservation program partnerships with other agencies, which result in \$7 worth of services provided to the community at a cost of \$1 to the District.

"West Basin's efforts to educate people about water conservation, desalination and recycling begins with sharing ideas and innovations among our community leaders," Smith said. "Partnerships are an effective, efficient means of doing business that result in increased value to the communities we serve," said Smith.

President Smith was elected to West Basin's Board of Directors in 2006 and has served as Board President for 2011. He serves the Division I Cities of Carson, Palos Verdes Estates, Rancho Palos Verdes, Rolling Hills Estates, Rolling Hills, and portions of San Pedro.
